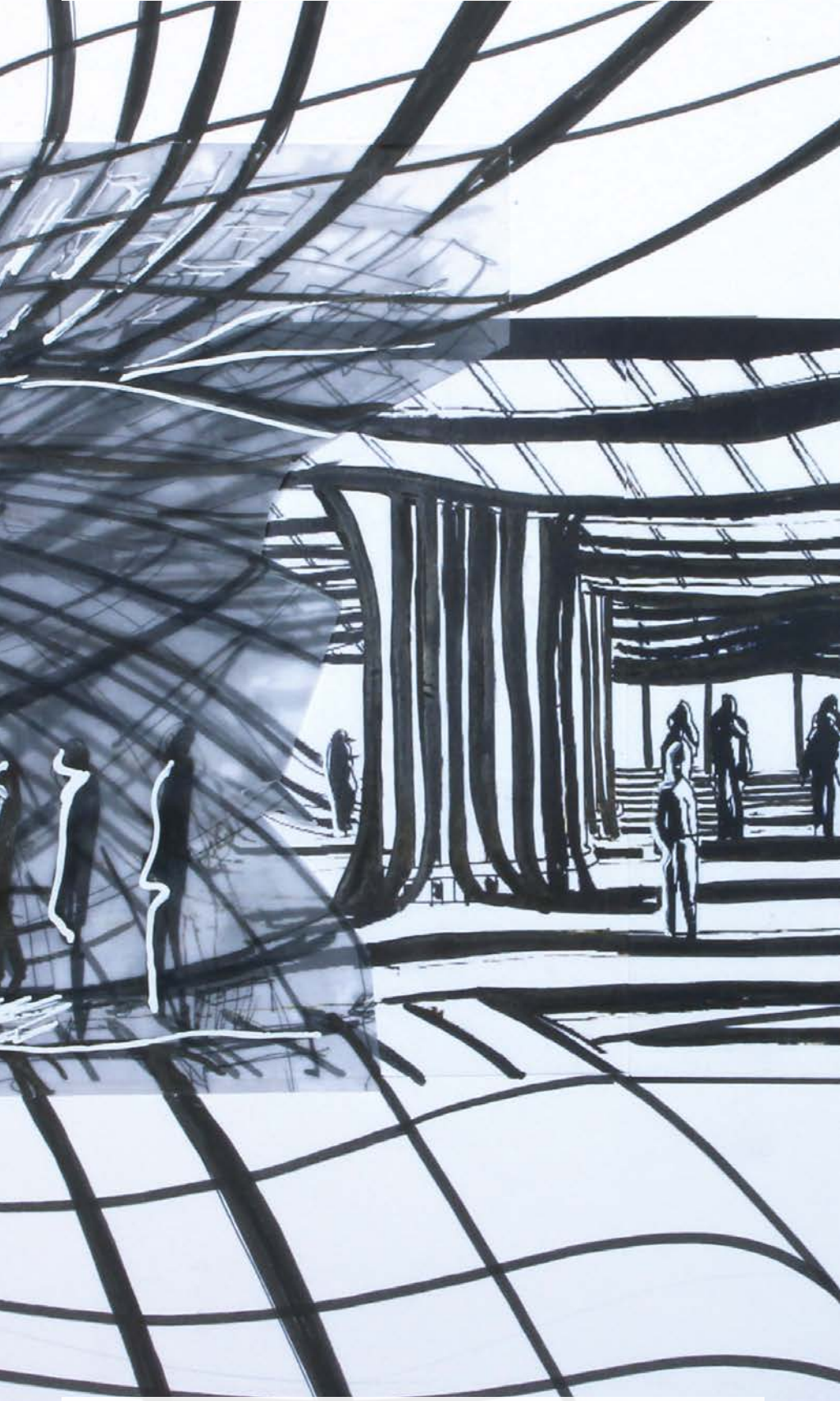


Architecture
